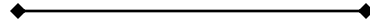

To Jesus Christ, Our Sovereign King

1. To Jesus Christ, our Soc'reign King, Who is the world's salvation, All praise and homage do we bring, and thanks and adoration.

Christ Jesus Ruler!

2. Thy reign extend, O king benign, To ev'ry land and nation, For in Thy kingdom, Lord divine, Alone we find salvation.
3. To Thee and to Thy Church great King, We pledge our hearts' oblation, Until before Thy throne we sing, In endless jubilation.

To Jesus Christ, Our Sovereign King was written in 1941 by Msgr. Martin B. Hellriegel (1890-1981). It is a response to the pretentious claims of Third Reich at the time, and a reminder for us that it must be Christ who Reigns in our lives. Fr. Hellriegel, who was born in Germany, came with his family to the United States as a child, and was ordained a Priest in 1914. In 1940 he was assigned to Our Lady of the Holy Cross Church in St. Louis, Missouri; which served a largely German-American community. In 1943 he built a new side altar to the Blessed Mother there which included on it's side a panel listing the names of all the young men from the Parish who fought in World War II.
