History of Lead, Kindly Light

In 1833, Saint John Henry Newman (1801-1890) was dying. Struck down with a horrible fever and bad homesickness while traveling in the Mediterranean, Newman desperately wished to return to England. Unfortunately, his ship was becalmed on his way home, and he became stranded in the Straits of Bonifacio. It was here, while Newman felt most depressed, that he wrote the poem *Lead, Kindly Light*. The words to this beautiful hymn are a prayer for guidance and comfort in times of trouble.

*Lead, kindly Light, amid the encircling gloom
Lead thou me on;
The night is dark, and I am far from home,
Lead thou me on.
Keep thou my feet; I do not ask to see
The distant scene; one step enough for me.*

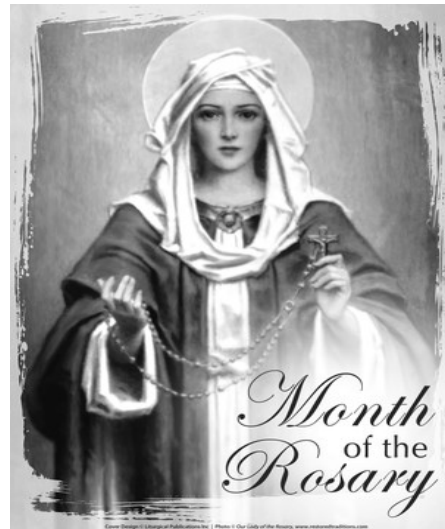
*I was not for ever thus, nor prayed that thou
Shouldst lead me on;
I loved to choose and see my path; but now
Lead thou me on,
I loved the garish day, and, spite of fears,
Pride ruled my will: remember not past years.*

*So long thy power hath blessed me, sure it still
Will lead me on,
O'er moor and fen, o'er crag and torrent, till
The night is gone;
And with the morn those angel faces smile,
Which I have loved long since, and lost awhile.*

Lead, Kindly Light provides comfort and reassurance that God leads when we are lost. It's not a surprise that the poem received popularity after Newman wrote it; many can relate to the feeling of renewed hope after calling upon God for strength.

*Fun fact: The words to the hymn are based on the scriptures Exodus 13: 21-22:

*And the LORD went before them by day in a pillar of a cloud, to lead them the way; and by night in a pillar of fire, to give them light; to go by day and night:
He took not away the pillar of the cloud by day, nor the pillar of fire by night, from before the people.*
