Cookie exchange: Please bring quart size zip lock bags filled with 4-6 of your delicious homemade cookies or Christmas treats. They may be all the same or mixed. The exchange will be done on a random basis, so there is no way to know whose cookies you will end up with! You will leave with the same number of bags you bring, however many you would like that to be.

Silly Ornament Exchange: Please bring a wrapped ornament in order to participate in this white elephant style game. \$10.00 limit, the sillier the ornament, the better!

Ornament Exchange game rules:



- 1) Each player brings one wrapped ornament.
- 2) Players draw numbers to determine the order of play.
- 3) Player 1 selects an ornament and opens it.
- 4) Player 2 selects an ornament and opens it. Player 2 then chooses to keep the ornament they just opened or switch it with player 1.
- 5) Repeat step 4 for all players. Trading is not limited to the previous player, however once an ornament has been traded 3 times, it cannot be traded again as it is "frozen".
- 6) When the last player has opened an ornament and chooses to trade (or not), Player 1 is allowed to trade their ornament with anyone, even a "frozen" ornament.
